- Keep Medicare/Medicaid and Social Security numbers safe.
- The Social Security Administration or Medicare will not call, text, email or contact you, except if you recently created an account online and they need to verify your information.
- Read your Medicare Summary Notice and health plan's Explanation of Benefits, then shred after you are sure the services and costs are accurate.

Partner Corner: Beware! Tis the Season for Charity Scams and Schemes

Have you donated to a charity? Did you check if the charity was legitimate? Be careful of con artists who pretend to represent a worthy cause.

Many organizations seeking donations will contact us by phone, mail or email. If we aren't careful, we may get taken by a group that sounds like a legitimate organization but is not. The schemers will call and thank you for a "pledge," then pressure you to pay quickly without

providing any details about their charity.

What will you do or say? Best to say, "no thanks" and hang up. Don't engage. Remember, never send cash, wire money or load pre-paid debit cards or gift cards. Resources to check out:

Administrative Support: Copying, filing, data entry and placing outbound phone calls and emails to support coordination of SMP activities yearlong.

Information Distributor: Transporting and disseminating informational materials to sites and events; to raise awareness of services and volunteering opportunities.

Exhibitor: Staffing kiosks, exhibits or health fairs in the community, providing general information about SMP to the attendees and answering basic questions.

Presenter: Giving presentations on SMP topics to groups of 5+; interacting with the audience; performing fun, scripted skits and activities to reinforce learning.

Counselor: Communicating with Medicare beneficiaries by phone, email or inperson about their individual situation; may require reviewing personal information, such as health conditions, bank account info, phone logs and other personal data and files that will be kept safe during the referral and/or investigation process.

Complex Interactions Specialist: Assisting with difficult or urgent cases of fraud or identity theft where time is of the essence. May act on behalf of the beneficiary to research the facts, refer to the proper authorities and follow up to ensure progress.
